# What is a Marine Event?

- An organized water event of limited duration which is conducted according to a prearranged schedule.
- Is likely to cause a high concentration of craft or otherwise interfere with normal navigation.
- Is likely to introduce extra or unusual hazards to the safety of human life.
- Cannot be protected against by existing navigation rules.



# **Event Sponsor**

- Responsible for submitting Application for Marine Event, Form CG-4423.
- Submission should include details such as:
  - Number and type of perimeter control vessels, safety vessels, etc.
  - Course information, dates and times, chartlets and geographic detail, areas for spectators.
  - Any required environmental or safety mitigation efforts (e.g. Waterfowl Avoidance Protocol).



# Sector San Diego Permit Determination Process

#### Six Stages:

- ➤ Stage One Outreach and Application.
- Stage Two Administrative Review.
- ➢ Stage Three − Safety Review.
- ➢ Stage Four − Environmental Review.
- Stage Five Issuance.
- Stage Six Monitor Event and Documentation.
- Note: At any point, the determination may be made that either a Permit is not required (No MEP Letter) or that the application is denied.



## Stage One – Outreach and Application

- Application submission schedule: 135 days prior to start of event; 60 days if it's a recurring event not requiring special local regulations.
- Communication between Sector San Diego Waterways Management (WWM) and Event Sponsor will commence. Event details will drive the extent of communications. Areas of followup or clarification could include event safety measures, dates and times, etc.



# Stage Two – Administrative Review

- This review, conducted by the WWM Office, will examine the event in its totality and how the event will impact or conflict with other events or operations on the waterway.
- Cursory analysis of factors such as location, number of participants/specators, weather, environmental.

# Stage Three – Safety Review

- Does the event pose extra or unusual hazards to the safety of human life? If so, Permit will be issued.
- > Examples of extra or unusual hazards:
  - Large amount of traffic and/or interference with normal navigation.
  - ➢ High speed traffic.
  - Location on the waterway.
  - Potential need for special local regulations or Safety Zones?



# Stage Four – Environmental Review

- Examination is conducted of the impact the event may have on the environment, including marine mammals and endangered species and their habitat.
- Communication and Coordination will occur between the Coast Guard and other Agencies (USFWS, NMFS, State Entities). This process may involve the Event Sponsor.



## Stage Five – Issuance

Permit Issuance to Sponsor.

Promulgation of special local regulations, notices of enforcement, Safety Zones, etc.



# Stage Six – Monitoring Event and Documentation

- > Monitoring of the event may be accomplished by:
  - Coast Guard Patrol.
  - Coast Guard Auxiliary Patrol.
  - Local Law Enforcement.
  - Post-event media analysis.
  - Communication between Coast Guard and Event Sponsor.
- Documentation records are kept locally at Sector San Diego WWM and on the Coast Guard's marine safety/security information database.
