Boat Storage: fenced compound capable of storing 20 small

sailboats, open rack capable of storing small sailboats, all

controlled by the Park District

Boat launch: pier and beach

Membership dues: \$75/yr. plus launching fees

Boats raced: Sunfish, Enterprise, Thistle, Vanguard 15

Membership: Once 100 families, now 0






